Shepherd's Crook Needs Your Help

In 2022, the Shepherd's Crook Food Pantry, our community outreach program, assisted 8,611 people operating on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday mornings. **Their mission is to feed the underserved families and individuals of Ocean**



City.

Food insecurity in our community is a bigger problem than many of us realize. Many of those we serve have seasonal jobs, however, they have difficulty making ends meet. Last summer we had to suspend Saturday operations in July and August because of high demands, volunteer availability and shrinking finances. That's why we are seeking your help.

Funding for the operation of the Shepherd's Crook Food Pantry is dependent upon the generous financial donations from individuals, service groups and businesses that allow us to purchase the food items we distribute. Our guests can choose a limited number of food items from a variety of canned and boxed food items, some nonperishable meat selections, and fruit, vegetables, soups, and pastas. Our volunteers shop every Wednesday to restock our shelves with food that provides the nutrition and sustenance our visitors need. But most of all, we provide a safe place to gather for a few hours each day and offer a kind ear and welcoming spirit that sustains people in tough times.

We serve anyone who walks through our doors. During the summer months, the demand on our food pantry grows exponentially, in large part due to an influx of international workers that support Ocean City's economy. In 2022, we averaged about 500 visitors per month in the first five months (January through May) but in the next four months, we averaged 1,031 per month (June through September).

We want to continue providing services to all who come to our doors, but our resources are limited, and food costs are rising. We are asking for your help to feed those who need a helping hand. We appreciate any assistance you can give as we approach our busiest season.



receive ongoing monitoring and pause travel for June

Following a recent hospital stay that detected internal bleeding and a new instance of heart arrhythmia, Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop Michael Curry is receiving thorough testing and monitoring to understand the relationship between his medication for atrial fibrillation and the episode of internal bleeding.

The necessary process of diagnostic appointments, treatment, and follow-up will take some weeks. To prioritize rest, and in keeping with doctors' orders to avoid air travel in the near term, Bishop Curry will not do any inperson events for the remainder of June.

Bishop Curry remains grateful for the outpouring of prayers and well wishes, and he covets your support moving forward. The Office of Public Affairs will share updates as they become available.
