#### Pastor Jill's October 15th Sermon on Stewardship

I'm going to transition us here because, interestingly enough, we know that the scripture always teaches us what we need to hear, and the gospel (Matthew 22:1-14) this week is talking about how we structure our lives, how important it is to show up fully in our lives to do the work of building God's Kingdom. And we as a church community know that this is an important thing to think about. We have all already answered the call to structure our lives in faith. And we come here to do that. But we know that we are asked to do more than answer that initial call. One of the ways we build the kingdom of God here on earth is through our church community. And this is the time of year when we received the invitation to decide about what our spiritual practice of stewardship will be for the next year.

Stewardship, what we give of ourselves to God's church - what we give of our money, what we give of our time, what we give of ourselves - stewardship, is a spiritual practice. Sometimes we think of stewardship as only the amount of money we give to church. Yes, the financial aspect is important – it costs hundreds of thousands of dollars for God's church to exist and carry out God's mission in the world. But it is so much more about our spiritual health than only saying - *Well, I give money*. It is more so about a decision to structure our lives in a way that puts God first and puts giving to God first. It is a decision to give up control in a way. To say - when I look at all that I have, material things, and my talents and my blessings, I want to acknowledge that all of it is a gift from God. And therefore I know that all of it is for God's direction and use. And so whatever I have - money, time, energy, *-first* I will give back to God...not the leftovers, not if I have extra time, or extra money, or a day off... but God has asked me to

structure my life so that He is first. So, first we give to God.

As people of faith, giving to God means giving to God's church. And then the church faithfully utilizes that money and talents that are offered to carry out God's mission. It is an act of great selflessness that is being asked of us. To say.... Here is my money for this month and *first* I think of God and what I will offer toward God moving in the world. Or, when I think of my time for this month, *first* can I commit to offering myself for God's use as God moves in the world. When we begin to think in such a way, something realigns in us. Everything else falls behind God. We show trust in God, that God will guide God's church to use our pledge and to welcome our talents in whatever way God directs. It is not in our control; it is God's.

In this way, we as a faith community participate in God's church moving in the world. And we are all invited to be part of what God is creating here. This year, we are asking everyone to imagine making bread - making a loaf of bread, all the many steps and all the many ingredients that are called for. The video above invites each of us to reflect on how we can be part of what this church offers the world. What will you give? What will you offer for God's direction and use? Because when we sit down to God's table, we want to arrive with our life structured properly and faithfully. And when we as God's church move in the world, we want everyone to be a part of it.


